



Recent Graduate Advisory Board Member *Proposed Bylaw Changes*

- 4.041 Each year, one Recent Graduate Advisory Board member will be elected to serve one three-year term on the Advisory Board.
- 4.041 (a) The elected member is eligible to serve only one three-year term, after which s/he must roll off for a period of not less than a three-year period.
- 4.041 (b) A maximum of three members in this category will serve on the Advisory Board at any given time.
- 4.041 (c) Members in this category are eligible for re-nomination in the future, after the mandatory roll off period.
- 4.041 (d) Members in this category are held to all expectations of board membership, including the payment of dues, and enjoy the same privileges of board membership. *[The current version of the bylaws sets dues at \$500 for board members under the age of 35 and \$1,000 for board members age 35 and older.]*
- (I) In order to avoid placing a personal financial burden on the board member, the nominees will work with the student officers to generate donations to a senior class gift.
- (II) Any senior class gift submitted by the graduating class will first be applied to up to 50% of the Recent Graduate Advisor Board member's dues.
- (III) Additional gifts from this class in years 1 and 2 following graduation will likewise be allocated to support up to 50% of this member's dues.
- (IV) Matching gifts for the remaining 50% of the Recent Graduate Advisory Board member's dues will be solicited from current Advisory Board members and Fellows.
- (V) Any remaining balance due after these efforts will be the responsibility of the board member.
- 4.041 (e) The nomination and election processes for this members in this category vary from sections 4.04 (a) and 4.04 (b) and are as follows:
- (I) In January, the graduating class will open nominations for students graduating in May, August, or December.
- (II) Only graduating students electing to be pinned and becoming Fellows will be eligible for nomination.
- (III) In March, up to three nominations will be forwarded to the Leadership Development Committee for inclusion on the ballot of the spring Advisory Board meeting.

- (IV) The director of the institute may elect to comment on the nominations to the Advisory Board, based on the nominees' involvement and qualifications.
- (V) At the spring Advisory Board meeting, board members will vote on the three nominees from the graduating class. The nominee receiving the greatest number of votes will be elected to for a term of service beginning on January 1 of the following year.
- (VI) Should an elected Recent Graduate Advisory Board member not graduate as anticipated, s/he will be ineligible for the position and the Executive Committee of the Advisory Board may vote for a replacement from among the two remaining nominees.
